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# **Some Thoughts on Mary's Advent Faith, Hope, and Joy**

The 2021 CSCO Advent virtual gathering was held on the feast day of the Immaculate Conception – December 8th. Steph Jarret led us in a prayer service which invited us to ponder and to learn from Mary’s example of an Advent faith, hope, and joy during her Annunciation (Luke 1: 26-56). Faith, hope, and joy has been three significant themes that came about as fruit of my prayer. Thereupon, I wish to expound my reflection from three important virtues that I saw in our Blessed Mother: humble faith, trusting hope, and responsive joy.

**Humble Faith.** I learned that the etymology of the word ‘humility’ comes from Latin ‘humus’ which means ground. Mary’s faith is grounded on her deep conviction that she indeed is beloved by God. That is why the angel Gabriel did not have to go through much length to assure her: “do not be afraid, Mary, for you have found favor with God (1:30).” She knows and is secure in the reality of God’s unconditional love for her. Most often, I find that the biggest setback I have with my spiritual growth is this certain inability to ground myself to the reality that I am ‘loved.’ It is easy for me to doubt other people’s intentions. And it is far easier to doubt my own capacity and worth. I think that these are moments of forgetfulness. I simply choose to forget how God’s salvation was manifested to me in the past. I forgot God’s work of mercy to me in the present, and his promise of fidelity to me in the future. In other words, I forgot God. But not Mary. She had no ounce of a doubt that God indeed favors her (1:48). Her humble faith empowers her to trust God with all her heart.

**Trusting Hope.** Mary reminds me that hope and trust are not two separate entities. How often do I find myself saying “I hope so?”- meaning I am not so certain that a desired outcome will surely happen. I often interpret ‘hope’ as an impossible dream: something so far from my grasp. And something that leaves no room for God’s work to take place with me. But not Mary. She cooperates with God. She relies on God’s fidelity to his promises (1:54-55) even when violence, injustice, and evil seems to prevail in the world (1:51-53). Her deep trust and hope empowers her to say ‘yes’ with great joy and conviction. She surrenders all that she is so that God may work wonders through her.

**Responsive Joy.** I have come to realize that joy is not simply a feeling of intense happiness. But rather joy is a grace that is borne from humble faith and trusting hope. St. Paul instructs the early Christians in Philippi: “rejoice in the Lord always (Phil. 4:4)!” Joy is something one can choose in authentic freedom. This realization invites me to confront the negativities I often hold in my life. I realize that yes, gratitude is a gift, but I can also choose it. I can choose to shift my life lenses from woes to blessings, from defeats to triumphs, from a self-enclosed tomb of rejection to the radiance of God’s love and favor which calls me come out in the open – so that I can be a mirror of God’s love and favor to others. Such is Mary’s joy. It is an empowering joy that moves one to respond to God’s goodness and grace with much magnanimity and generosity in spirit. It is a joy that freely chooses to return love for love.

Let us ask for Mary’s intercession that God may grant us the grace of a humble faith, a trusting hope, and a responsive joy. Pray for us O Holy Mother of God, that we may be made worthy of the promises of Christ. Amen.

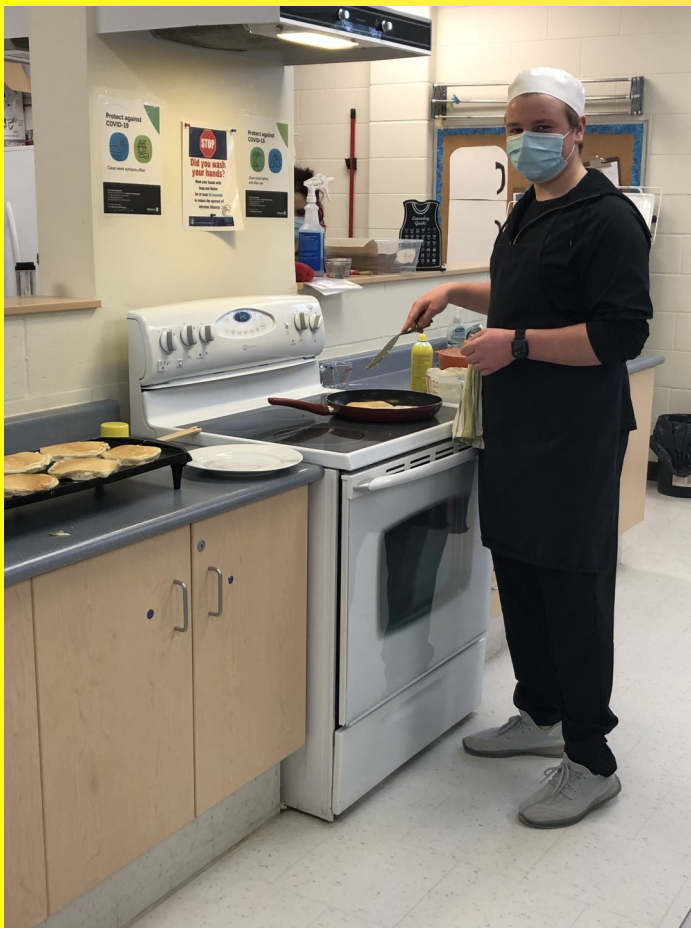

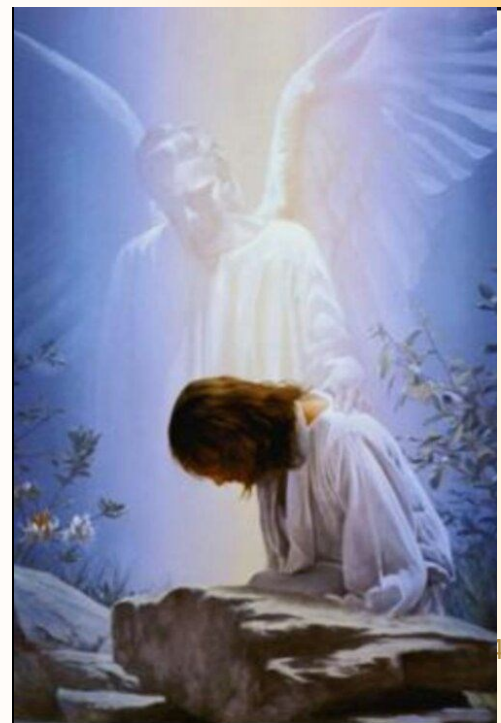



I think that this prayer speaks about someone who is so in love with Christ; and his attempt to match the unconditionality of love he experienced from the Crucified Lord.

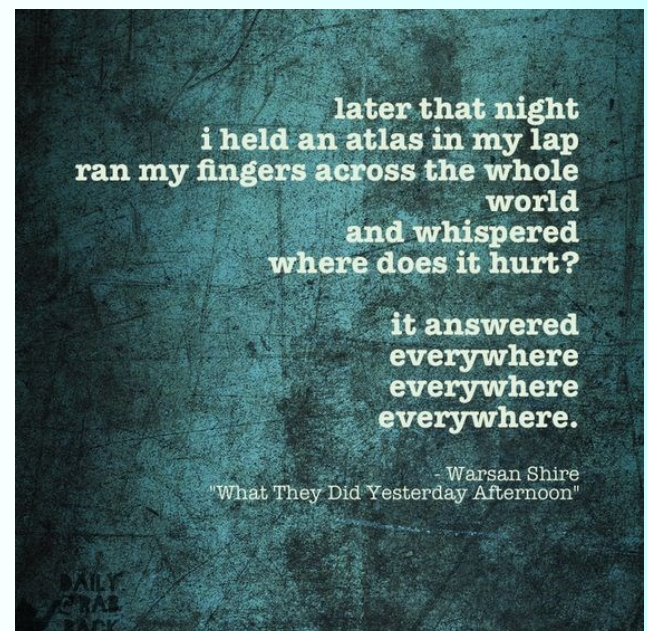
