Happy New Year!

In the previous edition of the CSCO newsletter, we were at the end of the liturgical year and I was wishing you the usual sentiments that come with a threshold of transition. Here we are at another threshold, this one brought on by the Gregorian calendar. It is difficult to fathom we are in the year 2023! Growing up in the 70s and 80s, it was difficult for my young mind to comprehend time beyond the year 2000! I've come to appreciate that these are just numbers. FYI--for the Jewish people, they are in the year 5781; for the Muslims, they are in the year 1441. On January 22nd, the Chinese welcome the Year of the Rabbit. I share this as a reminder that God is both in time and outside of time. Let us not get excessively attached to time and dates to the detriment of our priorities as people of faith--each day is a new day and a new chance to do better than the day before.

We now enter the liturgical season of Ordinary Time. It is anything but ordinary! At our virtual Advent Retreat (held on Dec. 9th) the insight came to me that we call this season ordinary yet there is nothing ordinary about life when there is a baby to look after; it is simply a 'new normal' as common parlance would put it. There is much compromise, loss of sleep and an habitual selflessness for the sake of this new person and this new reality. The needs of a vulnerable child demands more attention and care than the selfrealizing goals of our ego. Jesus is the game-changer that sets before us a new reality and mission that needs our attention and energy.

This mission is our 'new normal' from which we emerge, having spent time with fellow parishioners and loved ones reflecting on the mystery of the Incarnation. It reminds me of that well-known quote by Howard Thurman.

About two weeks ago, I took an Uber ride from home to Lakeshore Catholic. Throughout the trip, I had a meaningful conversation with the driver. He inquired about my work at the school. My response was met with a quick blank stare and silence.

I realized that I communicated not clearly enough. To be honest, it was a question that caught me off-guard. One that I was not prepared to give a clear answer. Then, by God's grace, I felt a strong stirring in my heart to share my faith journey.

I told him that I was born and raised in the Philippines. During senior high school retreat, I encountered Christ in a deeply personal way. The experience of God's unconditional love led me from parish youth ministry in college, to seven years of priesthood seminary formation, and then to campus ministry work for eight years. I moved to Canada in 2016. Yet somehow, God paved the way for me to practice Catholic lay ministry in the Canadian context. I obtained an MDiv degree from Regis College in 2021; and on that same year, I was hired as Chaplaincy leader.

I told him that at the heart of my calling is to draw young people to Christ: to make Jesus known and loved, and to help young people discover fullness of life through discerning one's path on how one can share in Christ's mission in our world today.

He thanked me for telling my life story. Somehow, I felt that he appreciated what I shared. I arrived at Lakeshore Catholic and thanked the Uber driver. I went straight to the Chapel and thanked the Lord for the grace of a renewed eyes of faith on the mission with which He entrusted me.



All I Am: A Catholic Devotional for Discovering Who You Are in God, by Caroline Pignat (Zondervan, 2022). \$21.00 CDN Caroline Pignat has written a book that helps our young people discover another narrative that nurtures a healthier self-identity, a Godgiven identity. Each section has 6 days of reflections, followed by a "Digging Deeper" section where the young reader can journal and do intentional reflecting on who they are in God. Then the reader rests on the 7th day and looks back at the insights gained in the past week. Each section can be adapted into a curriculum lesson, a Chapel visit activity or part of a retreat.
